This progress is reflective in the writing progress data too. On average, children in KS2 have made 8.5 steps in their writing. Children on the Lexia program have made 9.4 steps in their writing which is very comparable to their reading progress. This intervention is supporting Reading attainment in KS2 overall, which is 61% compared to 77%. The children are beginning to apply the skills learnt in their reading into their reading and this is increasing; 26% compared to 56% in Y3-Y6

My Maths	£339	This program was used as part of our Maths teaching to embed skills taught and fluency from the Spring term, which happened to be at the same time as the National lockdown. The impact of this intervention is measured in the Spr2 Arithmetic skills which has increased by at least 30% in each class, when compared to the scores from Autumn 2 assessments. Children continue to access MyMaths in school in small groups as well as using it as homework practise. The Progress Report for Maths details how MyMaths has supported our children in improving the overall progress of our Maths data. This has supported the teaching of maths and small group intervention with identified children.
