Dear Parent and Carers.

This term, in our PSHE lessons, Year 4 are looking at different aspects of health and hygiene and how to keep out bodies fit and healthy. As part of this, we will be learning about how to look after our teeth and the importance of good dental hygiene. This builds on our <u>Science</u> learning from earlier in the year where we looked at the structure of our teeth and the function of different types of teeth.

In order to give our PSHE learning a real-life context, we would like the children to have the opportunity to look at techniques for keeping our teeth clean and for them to see how effective their own strategies are.

The children will clean their teeth in school and then chew a disclosing tablet. Disclosing tablets temporarily stain the plaque build-up on teeth and highlight areas that children may be missing when brushing their teeth. We will then ask children to brush their teeth again to see how they can improve their brushing technique. The dye in the disclosing tablets is non-permanent and will not harm children's teeth or gums. We believe that this will be a practical way to support children to understand the importance of dental hygiene. As part of the lesson, we will discuss what constitutes good dental hygiene in more detail as well as looking at some of the risks associated with poor dental hygiene/diet on dental health.

There is no cost involved in this activity and you do not need to supply tooth brushes or toothpaste as we will provide all resources required. If you do not wish your child to participate in this activity, please let the school office know by Monday 15th May. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to ask myself or leave a message with the school office.


















BIKEABILITY OLYMPICS 2023 –

Invitation for your child to participate on 25th May 2023

Dear Parent

We are contacting you about an exciting opportunity for your child to participate the second heat of MK Bikeability Olympics 2023. This will take place at Middleton Hall in thecentre: mk shopping centre at 3.45-5.45pm on Thursday 25th May and is open only to pupils who have completed Level 2 Bikeability training, which your child has done this year.

The event is free and will consist of five contests based on the Bikeability core functions. The event is being organised by Cycling Citizens MK in partnership with Milton Keynes Council and will be led by Milton Keynes Council's Bikeability instructors.

The five contests are:

- Obstacle course contestants demonstrate Bikeability Level 1 skills using balance, dexterity, control, and skill to negotiate a series of obstacles.
- Slow race The winner is the last to cross the line! Contestants demonstrate Bikeability Level 1 pedalling and braking skills in three timed races; the overall winner is the contestant with the greatest amount of time spent riding over the three races.
- Pump relay race contestants demonstrate Bikeability Level 1 skills by taking turns to approach a large traffic cone
 with a bike pump on the top, take the pump, do a <u>U-turn</u> and replace the pump on the cone.
- Bike detectives contestants demonstrate Bikeability Level 1 skills identifying faulty parts on a bicycle; the winner
 is the contestant who identifies them all in the shortest time.
- Road Ride contestants demonstrate Bikeability Level 2 skills during a short ride on local roads with light motor traffic, using the four core functions (communication, observation, priority, and positioning).

The event will be free of charge and there will be certificates for all participants and prizes for 1st, 2nd and 3nd placed winners in each event.
