

English



Our English units will take inspiration from the **ron** key texts this term. For the first half term we will be using 'The Iron Man' by Ted Hughes as a focus for writing character descriptions.



After half term, we will continue to write character and setting descriptions using 'Stig of the Dump' by Clive King.

Personal, Social, Health and **Emotional Development**

In PSHE this half term we will be looking at friendships and *relationships*

Home Learning

We ask all children to complete the following tasks each week:

- Reading Children should aim to read for five minutes every day and log this in their reading journals. Twice a week, children should complete a longer response to their reading.
- Times tables Children should complete their 5 weekly garage games on Times Table Rockstars.
- Maths Children will be bringing home a maths homework sheet in their homework folders every Friday. We will mark homework together on Thursdays.
- Spellings Children will receive new spelling lists on a Monday to take home and learn. These will be tested on the Friday.
- English/Topic Children will be bringing home a task each week linked to their topic or English unit.

Library

Library day Mustard will be Fridays, please could all children bring their library books in to be able to change them.

Mathematics

In Maths, we will begin by focussing on number and place value, moving onto written methods for all 4 operations including reasoning and problem solving. We will also be focusing on securing accuracy of times tables.

Fluency target this term:

- To know number bonds of 10 upto 100
- To know the sums and differ-• ences of multiples of 10 up to 100.
- To confidently and quickly • recall 4 and 8 times tables.

Religious Education

The overarching key question for the first half term is: What do Muslims believe about God and where did Islam start?

Science

In Autumn 1, we will be learning about Rocks and fossilisation. We will then move onto Forces and Magnets in Autumn 2.
